### Worship

**NURSERY** is provided for children up to 5 years of age during Sunday worship services and special church events. All caregivers are screened and complete child abuse prevention training prior to employment. The Nursery can be found in the front hallway off Surface Hall. Please ask a Host or Usher if you need assistance.

**CHILDREN'S CHURCH** occurs during the 10:00 AM worship service and is for children age 3 years old through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. The children follow the cross out during the singing of the *Gloria* and return during the welcome and announcements.

**THE CHILDREN'S WORSHIP PACKETS** contain activity sheets and crayons/colored pencils for children to use during worship. They are located beside the stairs to the sacristy in Surface Hall just outside the nave. Please return them after the service.

THE CHILDREN'S QUIET BOOKS are handmade, felt and laminated books for use by children during worship services and can be found on a rack in Surface Hall. Parents and kids are encouraged to use these books during services. We ask that they be used gently and returned at the end of each service.

ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES are available and located at the back of the church in a basket on a table near the front door. These devices are free for use by parishioners, or guests, who range from being slightly to profoundly hard of hearing. The receivers pick up the wireless FM broadcast of all the lay and clergy speakers using microphones and reduce room echoes and other distracting sounds. Those not using hearing aids can listen to the receiver with the attached ear buds. Listeners who have hearing aids with a telecoil (telephone coil T-switch) setting option can use the receiver with a neck loop telecoil coupler. The loudness of sound can be adjusted with the volume control wheel located at the top of the receiver. Please stop by the bulletin board in Surface Hall and check-out the information under the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Ministry sign. **SACRED CONVERSATIONS** - Change is hard. Good or bad, it's just hard. Something is different, the familiar is gone, and your comfort zone is challenged. Many of us came to Christ Church because we wanted to make a change to find a place to worship God and celebrate Jesus. Even if you have been coming here since infancy, as you got older, the relationship you have with CEC has gone through many evolutions. Some of us came to Christ Church to find a safe place to sleep at night that was out of the wind and rain. Changes that may or may not have been our decision determined a lifestyle we are now living. Even though our reasons for coming here may be different we find ourselves all here. For a while we ran parallel courses until we eventually veered a little and ran in to each other. And now as we look around we see another big, awkward, uncomfortable change. Some embrace it, some shy away from it, and some just don't want it. That is true no matter what led you to Christ Church. All are valid feelings. We are all having growing pains. Change is also slow. How long did it take you doing "pew aerobics" before it became comfortable? Developing relationships with people takes time. Sharing space to have breakfast or a Wednesday noon meal may be a place to start. Setting expectations has helped develop a sense of community and mutual respect. Dividends are already paying off. Father Steve, Mother Becca, and Deacon Kellie have been asked for pastoral care from some of the newer participants. Shared news of job seeking and permanent housing have brought about a sense of pride and happiness to the speaker and the listener. Sleeping in the cloister is not a permanent solution. Maybe, just maybe, we can help the change that is needed, treat everyone with dignity, and remember we are all children of God.

### **ECM & EYC Mission Trips**

The Episcopal Campus Ministry will take a Spring Pilgrimage to the Peace and Justice Memorial in Montgomery, Alabama the first weekend of March. While there we will spend time steeped in prayer and in reflection of the ways in which race and racism play into our society, especially as we visit the site of the lynching memorial. Additionally, Mother Becca will offer readings from James Cone's The Cross and the Lynching Tree and the students will have time to reflect individually and communally about how we might better live into our baptismal covenant in light of what we observe.

The Episcopal Youth Community has two mission trips planned. In July, High School aged youth will be joining youth of Province IV in North Carolina to help with continued hurricane relief projects. Additionally, we are working with St. John's Church in Murray, KY on a mission trip in the fall for all ages.
