Worship

MAUNDY THURSDAY PRAYER VIGIL The sign-up sheet for the Maundy Thursday Prayer Vigil is on the bulletin board in Surface Hall. Please help us mark this most holy night by signing up for an hour to keep watch.

NURSERY is provided for children up to 5 years of age during Sunday worship services and special church events. All caregivers are screened and complete child abuse prevention training prior to employment. The Nursery can be found in the front hallway off Surface Hall. Please ask a Host or Usher if you need assistance.

CHILDREN'S CHURCH occurs during the 10:00 AM worship service and is for children age 3 years old through 3rd grade. The children follow the cross out during the singing of the *Gloria* and return during the welcome and announcements.

THE CHILDREN'S WORSHIP PACKETS contain activity sheets and crayons/colored pencils for children to use during worship. They are located beside the stairs to the sacristy in Surface Hall just outside the nave. Please return them after the service.

THE CHILDREN'S QUIET BOOKS are handmade, felt and laminated books for use by children during worship services and can be found on a rack in Surface Hall. Parents and kids are encouraged to use these books during services. We ask that they be used gently and returned at the end of each service.

ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES are available and located at the back of the church in a basket on a table near the front door. These devices are free for use by parishioners, or guests, who range

from being slightly to profoundly hard of hearing. The receivers pick up the wireless FM broadcast of all the lay and clergy speakers using microphones and reduce room echoes and other distracting sounds. Those not using hearing aids can listen to the receiver with the attached ear buds. Listeners who have hearing aids with a telecoil (telephone coil T-switch) setting option can use the receiver with a neck loop telecoil coupler. The loudness of sound can be adjusted with the volume control wheel located at the top of the receiver. Please stop by the bulletin board in Surface Hall and check-out the information under the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Ministry sign. SACRED CONVERSATIONS CLOISTER COMMUNITY UPDATE A significant part of the work that the Sacred Conversations group is trying to do in the Cloister is to build community. All of us know more names and stories than we did four months ago, but relationships take time and are slow to evolve. This past week at breakfast, one of our members sat down with an unhoused neighbor who talked about his hopes to become housed again and to get work, all with the knowledge that there are big hurdles to both of those things. But he also got to share about a time, years ago, when he came to Christ Church for help with his electric bill when he was housed; the bill was paid out of the priest's discretionary fund, but what stuck with him the most was the front desk worker who told him confidently that "God was with him" that day and the love he felt from his interactions at Christ Church. Relationships are often messy, but without the intentional work to get to know our neighbors, stories like these would not be heard; thanks be to God for the gift of his story and his willingness to share.

Outreach Spotlight

Clergy Discretionary Funds

The Clergy Discretionary Funds are set aside for the relief of the poor and other "pious and charitable uses." Here at Christ Episcopal Church, each of the three clergy members holds a Discretionary Fund, in the name of the congregation, which is funded by three main sources: 1) direct donations from parishioners, 2) loose plate offerings from the last Sunday of each month, and 3) donations made to the clergy by members and their families for performing the rites of the Church. These funds are distributed as needs arise to help with groceries, gas, rent, doctor's bills, and addiction recovery facility intake fees, among many other uses — we've even helped someone buy a car. Those who are helped by the Discretionary Funds are in emergent situations and have often fallen through the cracks, unable to be helped by other agencies in the area. Your generosity helps radiate God's love to folks who might not otherwise get to experience that grace, and our meetings with those in need are almost always occasions for prayer and giving thanks.
