# From The Associate Rector

The intimacy and importance of prayer is one that every Christian can quite easily assert. There are prayers that we know so deeply they are ingrained upon our hearts and minds, and there are ones that perhaps we tried, but it never quite fit. The breadth of different types of prayers is a gift of our shared faith. One of the hardest things about the abundance of ways in which we can draw ourselves to the presence of God is what do we do when a beloved way stops working. When I realize that the centering prayer app on my phone hasn't been open this whole pandemic season, I begin to worry. When my much-loved prayer beads, worn smooth by each cycle of prayer, lay untouched, I begin to worry that I just don't have it in me to pray in the middle of all that we are going through right now.

But then I remember the breadth of prayer that is available to all who desire to be in relationship with God. And then I remember that for a long period of my life, my prayer found its greatest depth in a small leather journal that went with me everywhere. And I remember that I find the visceral experience of hiking to be way in which I can easily bring the things that I'm holding in my prayer to the throne of our Lord. So, I pick up my journal and I head out to Mammoth Cave with my pups and I pray. With each line of black-inked cursive I bring to God all that I am anxious about; with each step that leads me deftly over old gnarly roots, I ask for God's help in things that I cannot even bare to name.

Despite the fact that I haven't sat in the quietness and stillness of contemplative prayer or found the peace of the repetitive nature of praying the rosary during this chaotic time, it has been a gift to rediscover ways in which I used to often pray. It doesn't take much fallow time for one to begin to think that prayer is just outside of our grasp, that it is something reserved for those who are more dedicated or faithful or less weighed down. Hear me when I say that prayer is never outside of one's reach, because, at its core, prayer is simply about relationship with God and this is something that is continually available, no matter how big your doubts or your worry or your frustration.

Even if we have to walk away from some forms of prayer that have served us so well throughout our years, prayer is never beyond our reach. In this season, this has looked like my prayer beads collecting dust, but still knowing that my prayers rise like the dew in the morning. Perhaps I'm not alone in the difficulty of prayer during this season of our common life, and my prayer is that when we struggle to find a groove in our prayer life that we can return to the simple truth that prayer is always available to us. A famous prayer of Thomas Merton's, found in Thoughts in Solitude, has been at the forefront of my mind lately. Particularly the last line, "you will never leave me to face my perils alone." May God's peace and grace be with you.

*My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think that I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road though I may know nothing about it. Therefore will I trust you always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.*

### WHAT IS GODLY PLAY?





# SACRED CONVERSATIONS PRAYERS FROM THE PORCH UPDATE

The Mission Grant Committee of the Diocese of Kentucky has extended its 2020 deadline for grants, of which the Prayers from the Porch project was a recipient, into 2021 due to the pandemic. While our original timeline has extended, the Sacred Conversations group continues to work with energy and joy on this project.

As our timeline for our Prayers from the Porch Grant extends further out than we had originally planned, the Sacred Conversations group wanted to extend an invite for you to contribute to this prayer book. As a reminder, the Prayers from the Porch Prayerbook will be a prayer book resource that is coming out of our relationships with our neighbors who are experiencing homelessness; it will contain passages of scripture, original collects, forms of praying with the body, coloring pages, and journal prompts. We have seen the ways in which we are all far more alike than we are different, and this time has only highlighted that for us. In your prayerful discernment, consider if contributing to this project is something to which you are being called either now, or if you would like to join the Sacred Conversations group working on this in the coming year. While we may not include all submitted prayers, we would love to see what the Spirit is drawing out in you. We are open to a variety of prayers, but these could include, but aren't limited to, prayers for navigating loneliness, being unable to attend celebrations, or concern for potential illness.

All submitted prayers must be original, approximately 3-6 lines, sent to Mother Becca at [becca@cecbg.com](mailto:becca@cecbg.com), and are due July 15th.

One of the most exciting and rewarding ministries at Christ Church is Education for Ministry (EFM). Exciting because it offers the opportunity to explore in depth one's faith and how that faith manifests itself in everyday life. Rewarding because one not only gains knowledge about Scripture but also the history of the Church and various theological perspectives.



However, one of the best benefits, if not THE best, is the relationship one develops with their fellow participants. A spirit of open discussion, confidentiality, and loving listening make the weekly sessions eagerly anticipated.

Christ Church has had a very strong EFM program for many years and is one of the few congregations offering both a morning and evening schedule, so everyone can take advantage. The program is offered through the University of the South in Sewanee, TN, and is completed locally over four years. Years One and Two focus on the Hebrew Scriptures and the New Testament respectively. Year Three focuses on the history of the Church going back to its beginnings. Year Four allows an examination of various theological ideas. Each of these topics also serves to lead the group into wide ranging and thought provoking discussions. If you are looking for a way to both broaden and deepen your knowledge as well as develop deep and abiding friendships, EFM is just for you.




# Church at Home: Creating a Prayer Space

Christ Episcopal Church will be offering Church at Home for the next several Sundays. To prepare, create a worship space and devote a specific time to come together.

- 1. Identify a space and find a small table to set up as a family prayer space. For the safety of children, look for sturdy furniture. For small children, choose a table low enough that they can reach.**
- 2. Find a cloth that, perhaps, matches the liturgical season. The color for Lent is purple and Easter is white. You can access a colorful liturgical calendar at <https://myfaithmylife.org/liturgical-calendar-2019-20/>**
- 3. Locate your family Bible and place it on the table. Use it to show your children where the stories that you are learning come from. You may want to find a stand or place it on a pillow to show the preciousness of the Bible.**
- 4. If you can, find a crèche from your Christmas decorations and set up the Holy Family. Make sure it is one that you want children to touch and hold so that they know that God is accessible at all times.**
- 5. Find a candle to light while you are around your table. (Be sure children cannot access lighters and matches and that only adults light the candle) This reminds us that God's word is light for us.**
- 6. Add some sacred art to your table. Children are attracted to beauty. This can include anything from a photo, an icon, a drawing that your child creates, or a plant or anything else that is part of God's creation.**
- 7. Find a small basket in which to deposit prayer requests. Allow children (and adults!) to say what is on their hearts.**
- 8. Find some pillows or blankets to place around your space so that it is comfortable when you are sitting together.**
- 9. Explain to children that this space is for them and they can visit it any time. Also, schedule a time when the whole family gathers. Sunday morning online worship is a good start. You can also use some of the suggested resources on our website ([www.cebgb.com](http://www.cebgb.com)) under the Learn & Grow ->Children's Ministry tab.**
- 10. Most importantly, make the space your own. If you can, take a picture of it and email it to [Laura@cebgb.com](mailto:Laura@cebgb.com) or share on our Facebook page! I'd love to see what you create!**
