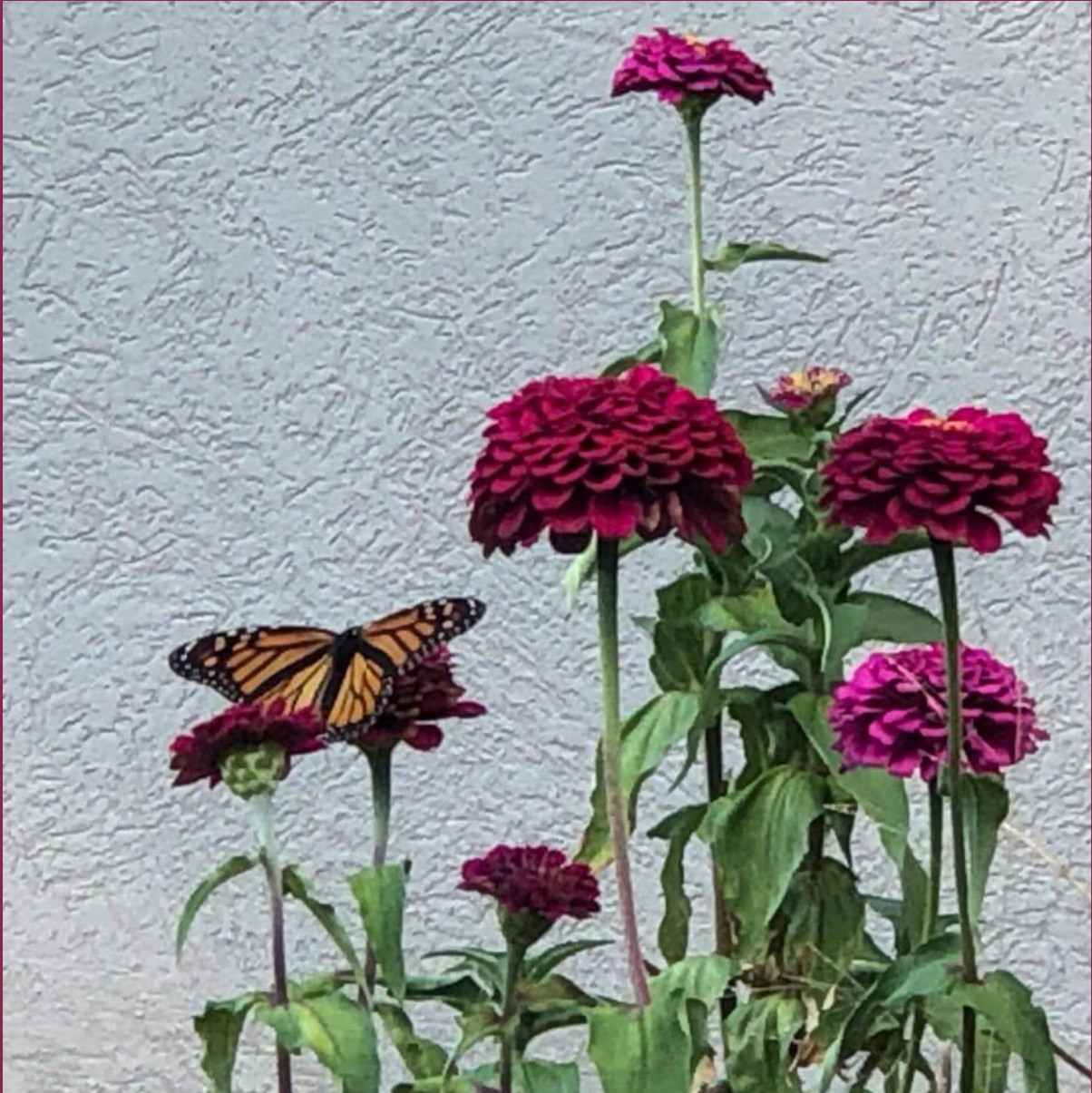

From The Rector

Dear Friends,

“Without a flip chart, there is no revolution.” It’s a line I remember hearing at some point in my seminary studies, and while it seems like a pretty silly thing to say, I’ve found that there is some truth in it, especially when that flip chart is used as a conduit for hundreds of 3x3 sticky notes like it did for our Prayer Walk Event and Vestry Retreat last weekend. Facilitated by my friend, the Rev’d Dr. Adam Trambley, Rector of St. John’s Episcopal Church in Sharon, PA, we spent the better part of seven hours praying, imagining, learning, listening, challenging, and growing.

Our goal was to listen for new ways in which Christ Church might be called to radiate God’s love in our neighborhood. The process started back in July as various members of the congregation took part in a series of five Neighborhood Prayer Walks. Going out about half-a-mile in four different directions, we asked God to open our eyes and our ears to the needs in our neighborhood. We noticed things that we’ve driven by thousands of times. We saw houses, businesses, and communities of people that we had never seen before. We noticed changes even in the course of a couple of months. We sought out where God might already be at work, where God’s heart might be breaking, and where signs of hope are emerging.



From there, we began to distill the information. Through at least five iterations of post-it notes and flip charts, we dig deep into what we had seen and heard, until priorities began to emerge. How might we reimagine charity in relation to our existing ministries? How might we discover and overcome barriers to this work within ourselves? How might we take our existing relationships in the community to a deeper level? While we might not have walked out of the meeting with a shiny new set of vision goals, we are well on our way to discerning where God might be calling us to invest our resources.

I am grateful for everyone who took the time to join us for a Prayer Walk, for those who have been faithful in praying for this congregations for many years, for those who took three hours Friday night to dig deep, and for our Vestry, who take their jobs as visionary leaders very seriously. For their willingness to engage their imaginations, to challenge one another, and be challenged, I cannot thank them enough.

Keep praying. Keep listening. And stay tuned. God’s got plenty more for us to do.

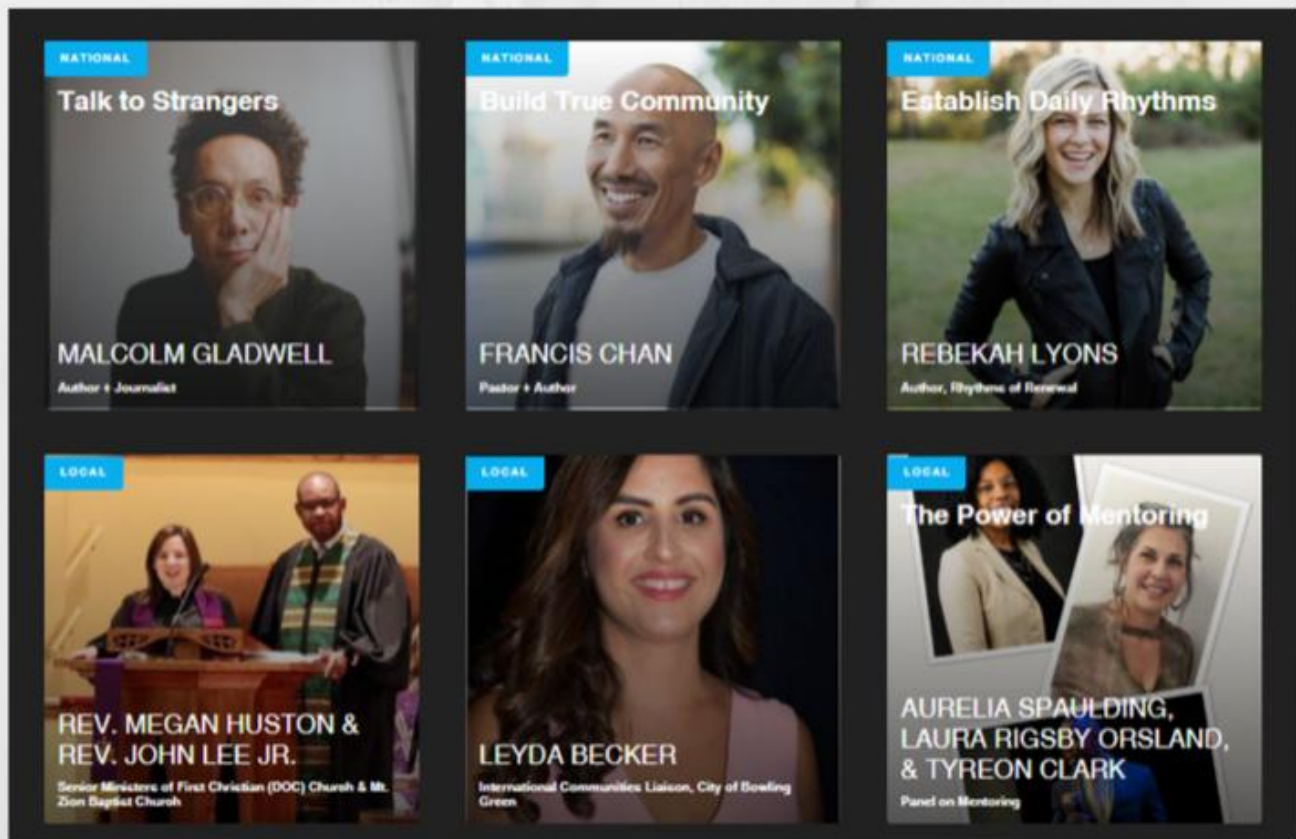

Four Rivers Deanery Mission Trip 2019

Last year I was blessed to attend a Formation retreat hosted by the Diocese of Kentucky. While there, I reconnected with my friend Father Matt Bradley of St. John's Episcopal Church in Murray and was introduced to St. John's Youth Leader, Angie Mills. We quickly formed a connection and realized we shared a need to create meaningful mission opportunities for our young parishioners. Over an ice cream at the Leitchfield Dairy Queen, we committed to working together, to sharing time, resources and energy, and to pray faithfully for such an opportunity to arise. (You know, the whole Kingdom of God thing!)

In a short amount of time, we determined a chance to serve God was right in our own backyard. Angie's husband Bill reached out to his friend, Brother Richard Quarles of New Jerusalem Missionary Baptist Church in Hopkinsville. Brother Richard was retired from ministry when he found himself frequently passing a dilapidated neighborhood church for sale. The neighborhood has its share of struggles with poverty, unemployment and substance abuse. The church's roof had collapsed in places, windows were missing, and the interior was damaged by vandalism and exposure to the elements. Brother Richard responded to the call of the Holy Spirit and invested all his own retirement income into the purchase and initial repairs to the church. He recruited 5 men from the neighborhood, most of whom were still engaging in substance abuse, and promised them if they would show up sober each day, he would give them work and pay them. Four of those men experience the love and grace of God through their work and shared time together with each other and Brother Richard. Each was baptized and became the founding members of what would become New Jerusalem Missionary Baptist Church!

The roof is now sturdy and strong, the ceiling and walls are repaired, and new doors and windows are installed. New Jerusalem holds Sunday worship services with open doors each week. But Brother Richard envisions the church becoming a place of community care on more than just Sunday mornings, so the work is far from over. He plans to renovate the basement into a kitchen and community hall for neighborhood activities. With that goal in mind, youth from Christ Church – Bowling Green, St. John's – Murray, and St. Paul's – Henderson got to work. We were graciously hosted by Grace Church in Hopkinsville and spent Saturday, September 14th scraping, scrubbing, and repainting the foundation and stairs of New Jerusalem. We also spent time together learning about the Way of Love, playing games, enjoying meals, and singing silly songs and dancing. We even taught Father Matt how to do The Git Up! (sort of)

When Angie and I initially shared our Lightbulb Moment that we could work together on a mission trip, we prayed and hoped that it might lead to a lasting relationship. I cannot begin to express how far the young people of the Four Rivers Deanery exceeded even our wildest dreams. Before we went to bed on the first evening, the youth were asking "when are we going to do this again?" They worked, played, laughed, and prayed so hard!

This is only the beginning of what I know will be a long and fruitful relationship between many of the churches in the Deanery and our communities across western Kentucky. We already have plans for next year on the calendar! I hope you will continue your generous support of the Episcopal Youth Community of Christ Church at our annual St. Valentine's Luncheon and other fundraising activities that may come up. We were privileged to take our gifts and use them for God's honor and glory as we are called to do. Thank you for helping us serve God together!

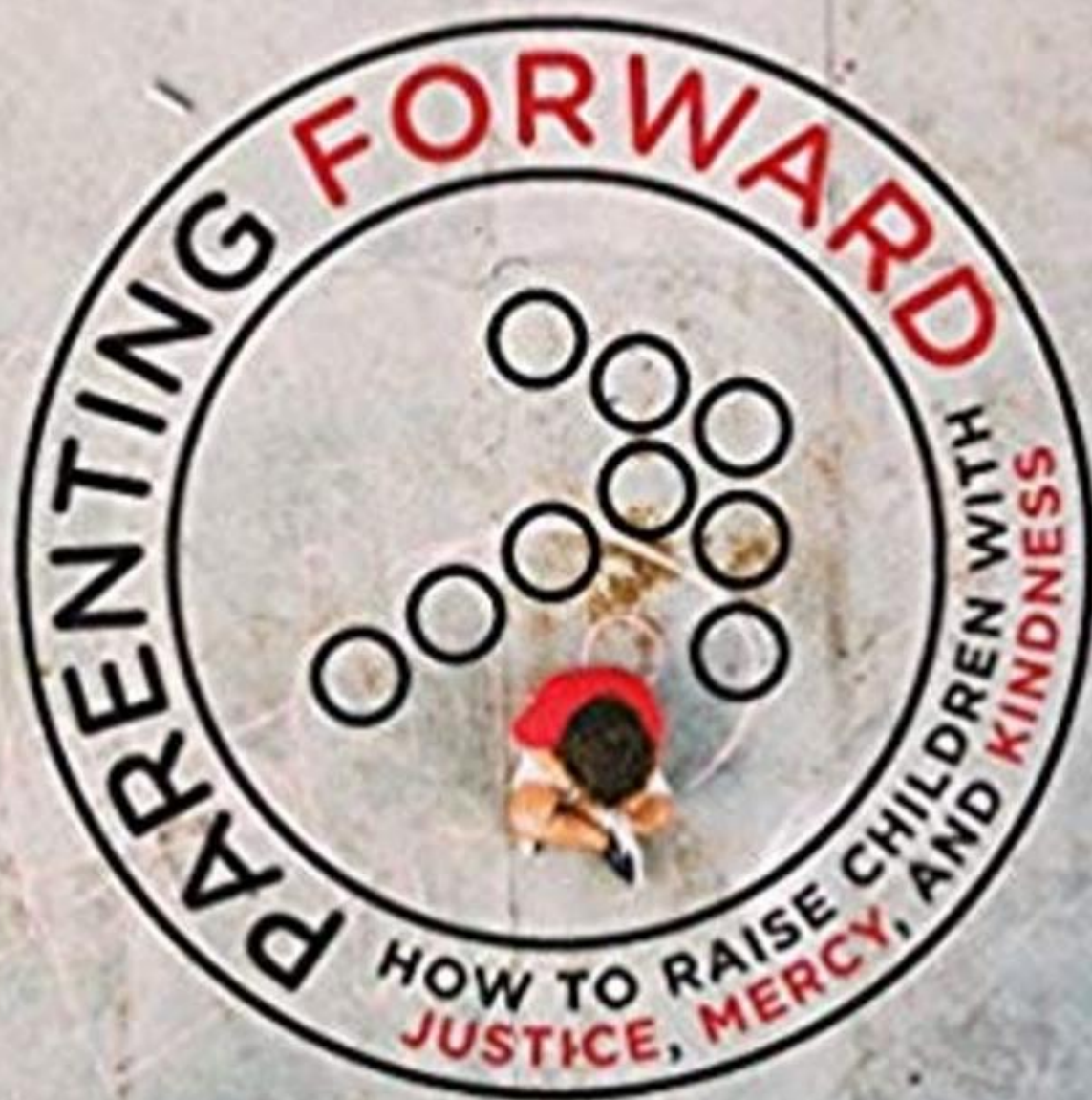

We are so thankful to everyone in the community that spends quality time with a child at Dishman. We are starting our 6th year in our new building and recently our school was recognized for being a "Lighthouse School" The relationships that you build with the students helps them to grow and learn each day!

The children of Dishman McGinnis need and want YOU!!! We are looking for people to commit to visiting a child at least twice monthly. This can be either reading with the child or eating lunch with them. That is basically up to the mentor. We are looking for you to spend approximately 20 minutes twice a month getting to know a child.

There are many activities that you can do with your mentee:

3. read
4. computer time
5. school parties
6. play games

Last year we had 80 gracious volunteers in our building. Our children could not wait to see their mentor. I could not go a day without a child asking for a mentor.

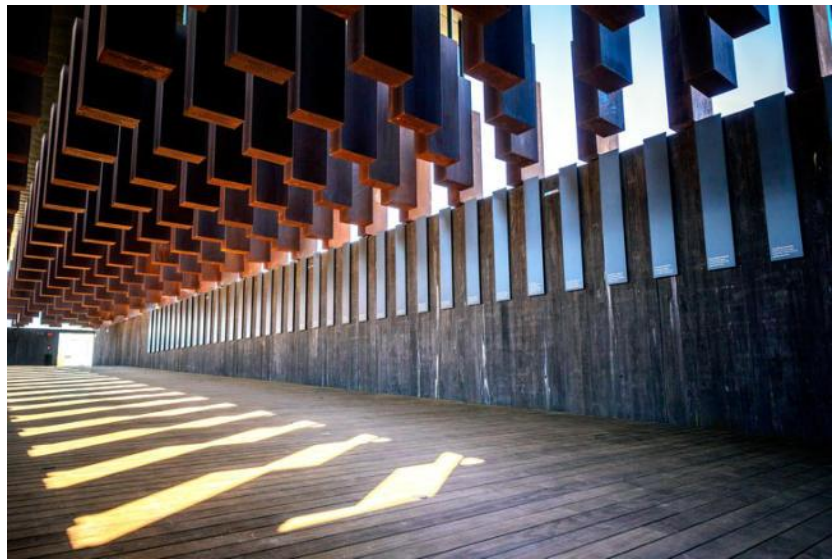

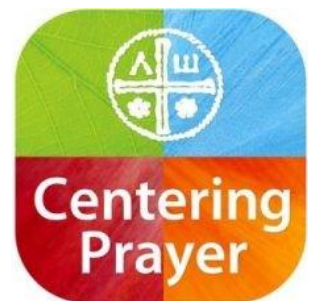

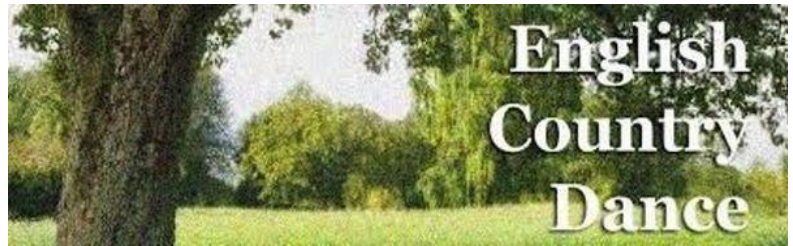

African Team Ministries

African Team Ministries is a Christian ministry working as an intermediary between African and American churches. With help from Episcopal, Methodist, Presbyterian, Lutheran, and Anglican denominations, we provide funding for orphan and refugee relief missions and evangelism in East Africa. The support received is sent directly to partnering Bishops to provide for:



- The care, health, & education of orphans
- Provision of jobs for unemployed woman as they make crafts, and are thereby enabled to care for their children & parents
- Resources for projects of refugee relief, health education, clergy & lay education, and building repairs as they occur.
- Family-sized drip irrigation systems which provide a controlled release of water for maize (a staple food) using only 5 buckets of water daily
- By providing scholarships at the former Pastoral Institute, now Presbyterian University, Thogoto, for pastoral students to ease the overburdened Presbyterian pastors
- By providing scholarships to Kenya Methodist University for education and training of Methodist pastor and lay pastors
- And most recently by sending a 40' container with 250,000 meals to Kenya, after the worst drought in 60 years caused a severe food crisis and left more than 3 million Kenyans facing malnutrition & starvation.

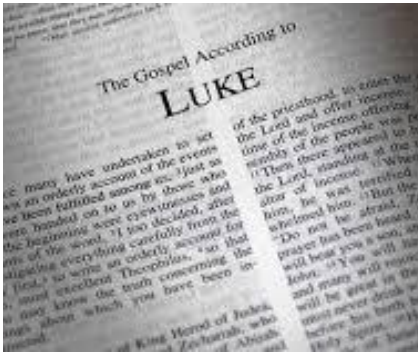
