ROOM IN THE INN HAS RESTARTED AT CHRIST CHURCH After a year off due to COVID, Christ Episcopal Church will once again take our place in the rotation of congregations hosting unhoused neighbors during the cold winter months as a part of Room in the Inn (RITI) beginning November 15th. We will host two Wednesdays a month with a maximum of 11 guests (either 6 men and 5 women or 11 of one gender). Masks and vaccination will be required of all guests and overnight hosts.
