

# From The Rector

Dear Friends,

During the announcements on Easter Day, I said that the office was closed Easter Monday so that we could get some sleep. Since my kids still had to get to school on time, sleeping past 6:30 wasn't really an option. Instead, I spent my Easter Monday accomplishing the tasks that had been neglected in the run-up to Easter. It was an absolutely beautiful spring day, so I spent plenty of time tending to the yard. Cassie was also off, so we enjoyed a lunch date out front of Gerard's. As it goes, there was also a significant need for groceries. So, while Cassie ran the girls to and from dance classes, I made my way to Kroger to get us set for the week.

Grocery store trips on the day after a major holiday are a good reminder of how the Church calendar is often at odds with the secular calendar. While we were just beginning the Great 50 Days of Easter, Kroger was selling chocolate bunnies at 50% off. With our first Alleluias still ringing in my ears, I pondered my own self-control and the wisdom of buying a half-dozen bags of Starburst jelly beans marked down 75%.

Liturgically, we Episcopalians mark the Great 50 Days that run from Easter to Pentecost – which is the Greek word for fiftieth day – in a few special ways. After a season of bare wood and flax vestments, white and shimmering gold will adorn our altar hangings and vestments until the bright red of Pentecost. The Prayer Book requires that the Paschal Candle be lit for every service during these 50 days. Having dug up the Alleluia banner, the liturgy invites us to say it as often as possible during the Easter Season. Our opening acclamation will be a reminder that we worship a savior who is risen from the dead.



Despite the worldly desire to always be looking to the next big thing, our Church calendar invites us to revel in the celebrations for a while. Maybe you'll want to buy some extra Easter candy at sale prices so that in June, when we are still in Eastertide, you can abide in the season for a few more days while you enjoy a Reese's Peanut Butter Egg. Other ways you might hold on to the joy of the resurrection abound. If you gave up something for Lent, why not try adding something in Eastertide? You might set aside five minutes each evening to name all the things you are thankful for that day. Perhaps you could read a resurrection story from the Gospel accounts each day? In our Gathering Area now hang 14 Stations of the Resurrection, made from the remains of the copper sculpture that was stolen from the Buckberry Garden last winter. Walking those or our beautiful labyrinth are great way to set yourself about the resurrection life that is made available to us all in the miracle of Easter.

May you find joy in the resurrection (and maybe a few extra helpings of Easter candy) during these Great 50 Days!

# From The Associate Rector

Dear Friends,

“For those who pray here and those who sleep here,” has become one of my standard prayers as I hold the life of faith of the members of Christ Church in my prayers, and also for those in the Cloister Community who are currently facing homelessness and find our cloister to be a place of refuge, safety, and hopefully rest. A few months ago, we began to take dedicated time to pray out in the cloister; every Monday at 4pm a few folks gather at the benches by Moore Hall and connect a little bit and then we pray.

Just like the Cloister Community itself, Prayer on the Porch is ever evolving, and has yet to look exactly the same week-to-week. Through bitter cold, rain, and gusty winds we have held for prayer in that space, and it has become some of the most sacred time for me in my weekly rhythm. There are weeks when it’s just one person, and there are weeks when we’ve had nine; it’s been a mix of clergy, congregants, and members of the Cloister Community, but it is always a holy space that helps to ground our work, our relationships, and the next steps we take in prayer.

Prayer on the Porch has yielded much fruit, and it’s still unfolding. Out of this weekly offering, the Sacred Conversations group held a Maundy Thursday Foot Washing in the Cloister during Holy Week, and many who have participated in Prayer on the Porch came and worshiped. One of the things that we are learning and seeing is that to ground our work and relationships in prayer is, in fact, changing our relationships.



Like many folks who don’t have a church home, religion and the church have a checkered past with many members of our Cloister Community, but a fruit that is coming from Prayer on the Porch is that some members of the Cloister Community have begun to come to worship with Christ Church; during Holy Week, each day of the Triduum we welcomed folks into worship. I give thanks for this, because in the light of the joy of the resurrection, I truly believe that the hope of Christ is for all. You are invited to come and pray with us on the porch on Mondays at 4 as we worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.


# Stations of the Resurrection

Please take time to walk the Stations of the Resurrection hanging in the Gathering area. The stations were created, under the direction of local artist and parishioner Shanna Paul, during our Lenten L.O.F.T. class with copper panels salvaged from the garden trellis as well as found objects brought by the participants in the class. The class was based on the book *A Resurrection Shaped Life* by Bishop Jake Owensby. The Stations are drawn from St. Augustine's Prayer Book to illuminate the gospel accounts of the Risen Lord's encounters with his disciples. "This devotion...draws the various gospel stories together and provides a framework for each of them." On your own, using a booklet, you are encouraged to walk the Stations as a means of reflection and prayer during Eastertide.

## Artist's Statement by Shanna Paul

The Book of Common Prayer states in the General Thanksgiving, "All the blessings of this life." One of the blessings of this life is shelter and the pride of home ownership. One of the ways that Christ Church, Bowling Green has helped others experience that blessing is by sheltering the unsheltered, assisting with financial needs, and supporting the work of our local Habitat for Humanity Chapter.

In 2005, the Rev. Jim Quigley, former Associate Rector of Christ Church, and Shanna Paul, parishioner, created works of copper that were sold at auction to benefit Habitat for Humanity of Bowling Green. Copper and glass were incorporated in the works to illustrate the passage from Chapter 21 in the Book of Revelation "...a city whose walls and streets are pure gold, clear as glass." Parishioners sponsored individual copper squares as they were hung on each of two trellises. One of the copper trellises was purchased and donated back to the church for installation in the church's memorial garden.



Nearly 15 years later that copper trellis was stolen. It was subsequently recovered (albeit severely damaged) at a local recycling center.

As Lent approached, Father Steve and Laura Goodwin began planning a L.O.F.T. (Living our Faith Together) series to study Bishop Jake Owensby's book, *A Resurrection Shaped Life*. An idea for the resurrection of the copper trellis was born!


Participants in the L.O.F.T. groups painted, gathered, glued and hammered while reflecting on how and what the resurrection teaches us. As Bishop Owensby assures us, Christ is risen and he is imparting new life to us "as we stumble and scurry and skip and dance our way along our various paths." The result of these sessions was the creation of these 14 very personal and visually dynamic Stations of the Resurrection using the refurbished copper squares from the original trellis.

# Sacred Conversations: Cloister Community

SACRED CONVERSATIONS CLOISTER COMMUNITY UPDATE One of the joys of parish life is the opportunity to pray for each other through joy or pain; our parish prayer list is extensive because there are so many prayers that each of us are carrying throughout our days, and there are some with which we just need a little extra help. Our prayer list is broken up into sections to make it more manageable, and one of the sections that we have had for a while is to pray for our Cloister Community. Our homeless and unhoused neighbors certainly need our prayers as they navigate this life without shelter, but they, just like all those who pray in our pews, carry other prayers as well. Through the relationships that the Sacred Conversations group has intentionally been developing over the past several months, we have been able to get to a point where a standard part of our conversation is to ask what prayers the folks out in the Cloister might be carrying, how we might pray for them, or what joys they have. Last week we started to include the names of those who have asked us for specific prayer requests or to celebrate in thanksgiving with them for good news; just like other members of Christ Church, their prayers range from heartbreaking to exceedingly joyful, and while you may not know the specific prayers that they have requested, please join us in naming them specifically in your prayers.






