From The Rector

Dear Friends,

I promise that flying isn't going to become a recurring thing in my Window articles, but I am writing this one from an airplane. I'm not in a Cessna 172 four-thousand feet above Oakland, KY, but in an MD88 operated by Delta Airlines some twenty-four-thousand feet above Georgia somewhere. I'm on my way to a funeral – the kind of funeral you never want to attend. One of my former youth ministry students, Eme, died at 18 years old in a single-car accident over the weekend. Pray for her and her family.

This could be one of those moments when I just spit out a bunch of clichés and hope you don't notice. Hug your kids. Tell your partner that you love them. Buckle your seatbelts. You know, the kind of life advice that will sell Tim Tebow's new book, but probably isn't the sort of deep insights you've come to expect from the front page of the Window.

Instead, what is on my mind in this moment is what an honor it is to serve God, the Church, and God's people in this way. As I was packing my bag last night, Cassie said, "How crazy is it that you have to talk to people about this?" Crazy indeed, though, to my mind, no crazier than her occupation that requires her to stick sharp instruments in people's mouths in order to pick grossness off their teeth.

Still, when in my healthier moments I reflect on the life and ministry of a priest, it is an odd vocation indeed. On any given day, I could be in a hospital room, a board room, or on the road to meet the Bishop in Louisville. On any given day, I might be celebrating a marriage, a new child, or a job retirement on the heels of sitting with a family planning a funeral or hearing someone's confession or finding a way to help an addict get into rehab. On any given day, I have no real clue what I'm going to be doing, despite a calendar that is filled with color-coded events, meetings, phone calls, and services.

What I do know, is that on any given day, I will be blessed to see God's hand at work in the world. By the time this week is over, I will have preached, celebrated the Eucharist, blessed pets, buried our neighbor's beloved dog, preached a funeral, officiated a wedding, and baptized a baby. Crazy! Even, and maybe especially, in those most challenging moments, like the funeral tomorrow, for which I should be writing a homily instead of this article, I get to witness the grace and love of God at work in a world that desperately needs it. Maybe it is because, in those moments of desperation, I'm more in need of seeing God, but I like to think that it isn't based on me at all. I'm pretty sure that it in those moments of trial, sadness, hardship, and distress that God pours out a double portion of the Spirit because that is the very nature of God.

It is an honor and a privilege to walk with folk through those moments. And while it might be really a strange way to live life, I'm grateful for God's call to serve those in need. Thank you for the opportunity to walk this road with you.

From The Associate Rector

Dear Friends,

Throughout my life there have been many places in which I have felt God's call upon my life, but none might have played a greater role than serving as a chaplain in a small-town Texas hospital. Before I began the formal discernment process for the priesthood, I was in personal discernment about whether or not God might be calling me to work in this hospital or in the church. My time working as a chaplain affirmed many things I knew to be true about myself, but it also gave me the gift of helping me learn some difficult things about myself, as well; as with all discernment, it was both challenging and joyful, painful and beautiful. One of the things that I learned was that while I am not good at maintaining healthy boundaries in emergency situations, my vocation often finds its fulfillment in walking with people through grief.



I am comfortable in the dark places through which we all must walk any time we find ourselves in grief. One of the things I have learned through this past year with all of its surgeries and brokenness, this comfort is limited, though, because I would rather walk with someone than have to walk myself through the space of grief. One of the things I often found myself explaining in hospital rooms as a chaplain was the ways in which every illness, surgery, or broken bone makes us walk through grief. While those in the hospital bed might not be grieving a loved one, they are grieving the loss of their health, or mobility, or freedom. Grief is a process that can't be hurried and requires us to stay present in the moment. One of my favorite prayers in our prayer book is a prayer that I was drawn to before my leg break and surgery, is a prayer from the Ministering to the Sick in our Prayer Book; it's a prayer that has helped me in a different way as I navigate recovery. It is A Prayer for in the Morning:

This is another day, O Lord. I know not what it will bring forth, but make me ready, Lord, for whatever it may be. If I am to stand up, help me to stand bravely. If I am to sit still, help me to sit quietly. If I am to lie low, help me to do it patiently. And if I am to do nothing, let me do it gallantly. Make these words more than words, and give me the Spirit of Jesus. Amen. (BCP, p. 461)




WHAT IS GODLY PLAY?






