ROOM IN THE INN HAS RESTARTED AT CHRIST CHURCH After a year off due to COVID, Christ Episcopal Church will once again take our place in the rotation of congregations hosting unhoused neighbors during the cold winter months as a part of Room in the Inn (RITI) beginning November 15th.
